The candidate will also assist the staff on a variety of other analyses and will occasionally assist the glassware processing area. The work is performed in a modern laboratory with a 7:45 am to 4:30 pm work schedule.

The candidate will learn the use of computer software in Laboratory Management will interact with chemists, biologists, engineers and geologists involved with environmental management, and will come to appreciate the use of a quality management plan in day to day laboratory operations.

The incumbents works under a permanent staff member, may be alone in laboratory room with assigned task, staff members are always nearby.

Education Associates degree in engineering, a biological-life, physical science, math or natural resources field.

Experience At least six months of work experience relevant to specific job duties.
