PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

DISCHARGE PERMIT: PRETREATMENT

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT Regulates the discharge of high strength waste and toxic pollutants from industrial and commercial activities to municipal wastewater treatment facilities.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY Electroplating, metal finishing, cheese manufacturing, landfill leachate, ice cream manufacturing, breweries, etc.

CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION Permit is needed for the discharge of any waste that may adversely affect the proper operation of a municipal wastewater treatment facility.

INFORMATION REQUIRED Description of the industrial or commercial process generating the wastewater, volume of wastewater discharged, type and concentration of pollutants present, plans and specifications of any treatment system proposed by the applicant, location of discharge.

FEES New or Amended Permit: \$0.12 per gallon of design capacity application review fee, minimum \$50.00 per outfall, plus \$100.00 administrative processing fee per application.
 Renewal Permit: \$100.00 administrative processing fee per application.
 Annual operating fees are calculated at \$0.0315 per gallon of design capacity. \$100.00 minimum; maximum \$27,500.00 per outfall.

APPLICATION TIME FRAME The performance standard for processing a complete application:
 New individual permit 150 days; with hearing 195 days
 Renewal permit 120 days; with hearing 165 days
 General permit (remediation, pretreatment) 10 days (NOI)

APPEAL PROCESS	Effective January 31, 2005, within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary, or any party by right, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of 10 VSA Chapter 220 .
