**AIR POLLUTION CONTROL ANNUAL REGISTRATION:
 STATIONARY SOURCES**

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT The primary objective of the annual registration program is to collect information related to the operation of stationary sources and their emissions on a yearly basis.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY Projects that are classified as a stationary source of air contaminants. These include, but are not limited to: industrial processes (furniture manufacturing, coating operations, plywood and veneer manufacturing, concrete batching, hot mix asphalt production); fuel burning equipment (space heating, power utilities, and incinerators) and; mineral processing operations (rock crushing and/or screening operations).

CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION All stationary sources actually emitting at least five (5) tons per year of all air contaminants must register annually. Stationary sources emitting five (5) tons per year or more of all air contaminants in total are required to pay a fee as part of the annual registration process. The associated fee is based on the type and quantity of emissions, and the type and amount of fuels burned by the stationary source.

INFORMATION REQUIRED Information regarding annual production, raw product usage, fuel consumption operational characteristics, and stack parameters; descriptions of processes and equipment specifications; and optionally, quantification of pollutant emissions.

**ANNUAL REPORTS
DUE**

On or before February 1 of each year, the operator of the source must submit operational and emission data for the preceding year.

On or before May 15 of each year, the operator of the source from whom a registration fee is due must submit the registration fee.

**APPEAL
PROCESS**

A request for reconsideration of a fee determination or contest of a final decision of the Air Pollution Control Division pursuant to 5-803 of the Vermont Air Pollution Control Regulations may be made to the Air Pollution Control Division within 30 days of receiving notice.

Effective January 31, 2005, within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary, or any party by right, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of [10 VSA Chapter 220](#).
