PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

**HAZARDOUS WASTE TREATMENT, STORAGE,
 DISPOSAL FACILITY (TSD) CERTIFICATE**

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT Certification is required for all hazardous waste treatment, long-term storage, or disposal (TSD) facilities. Prior to obtaining certification, a "Certificate of Need" is a pre-application requirement for all treatment or disposal facilities (not storage) (10 V.S.A. § 6606a, VHWMR § 7-504). TSD certifications are issued for a period not to exceed five years.

TRIGGER ?? YOU NEED A PERMIT IF ...

Are you going to store or treat hazardous waste from other generators?
 Are you a large quantity generator who wants to store hazardous waste longer than 90 days?
 Are you a small quantity generator who wants to store hazardous waste for more than 180 days?
 Are you going to treat hazardous waste on-site?
 Are you going to dispose of hazardous waste on-site?

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY

Any facility that treats, stores or disposes of hazardous waste including but not limited to: transfer stations which store for longer than ten (10) days; surface impoundments; incineration facilities; storage facilities; landfills; and recycling facilities that store waste on-site for more than three (3) days.

CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION

With a few limited exceptions (found at VHWMR §7-502), all persons who treat or dispose of hazardous waste must first obtain certification. All persons who engage in long-term storage of hazardous waste (greater than 90 days for "large quantity generators"; greater than 180 days for "small quantity generators"), or who accept hazardous waste from off-site, must also obtain certification.

INFORMATION REQUIRED

Applications for TSD facilities require the following information:

1. identification of the owner and operator of the facility
2. specific information and maps to describe the facility and its location
3. list of the types and amounts of hazardous wastes handled by the facility; also a procedure for characterizing these wastes.
4. description of the processes used to treat, store or dispose of each specific waste.
5. description of the security procedures and emergency equipment to be used by the facility.
6. a contingency plan for emergencies.
7. an employee training plan.
8. a facility closure plan.
9. documentation of financial assurances for facility closure and for civil liability arising from sudden incidents at the facility.
10. waste management personnel background review forms (10 VSA § 6605f).

APPEAL PROCESS Effective January 31, 2005, within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary, or any party by right, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of [10 VSA Chapter 220](#).
