PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT LICENSE

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT This is a license which a person, partnership, or corporation must obtain before they are allowed to operate a restaurant.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY All restaurants that cater to the public by means of advertising and operate for more than one day in any one-month. This includes home catering and commercial catering, as well as fair stands.

INFORMATION REQUIRED The application requests information about the licensee, the type and capacity of the facility being licensed, type of water and sewage systems serving the facility, proposed opening date and public building permit status and the applicants' status with the Tax Department.

APPEAL PROCESS	The Board of Health issues licenses. A decision of the Board may be appealed to the Vermont Supreme Court under 18 VSA 128(b).

Plan review and permit from the Department of Public Safety, Fire Safety Division. See Sheets # 49, 49.1, 50, 50.1, 50.2, 50.3.3. License to collect taxes from the Department of Taxes. See Sheet #93.4. License to sell beer and wine. First class license must be obtained from the town.5. License to sell liquor: Third class license must be obtained from the Liquor Control Board. See Sheet #90.6. For building renovations, an asbestos assessment from the Department of Health. See Sheet #54.
