PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

WASTE TRANSPORTATION PERMIT

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	The Agency of Natural Resources issues waste transportation permits for hauling hazardous, solid, and residual wastes to or from any location in Vermont. The permits have a duration of five years. All permits are required to be renewed annually by June 30th. Potential solid waste haulers should check with their local solid waste management district for additional permit requirements, if any.
CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION	Commercial haulers are required to obtain and maintain a waste transportation permit. A commercial hauler is defined as (a) any person that transports regulated quantities of hazardous waste; and (b) any person that transports solid and residual waste for compensation using a vehicle having a rated capacity of more than one ton.
INFORMATION REQUIRED	The information required to apply for a waste transportation permit includes the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Company Name and Contact Person; 2. Identification of each vehicle to be used to transport waste; 3. Types of waste to be transported; 4. General waste origin and destination; 5. Disclosure statements (10 V.S.A. Section 6605f); 6. Certification of employee training (hazardous only); 7. Insurance and financial responsibility documents (hazardous only); 8. U.S. EPA identification number (hazardous only).

FEES	Residuals & Solid Waste Hauler Permits-\$35.00 per truck, tractor, trailer. Hazardous Waste Hauler Permits-\$100.00 per truck, tractor, trailer.
APPLICATION TIME FRAME	The performance standard for processing a complete application is 30 days; However please allow up to 90 days for the required background review.

**APPEAL
PROCESS**

If certification is modified, suspended, revoked, or denied, a written statement of reasons will be supplied to the transporter involved. The transporter has 30 days from receipt of the statement to request a hearing to the Secretary of the Agency of Natural Resources.

Effective January 31, 2005, within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary, or any party by right, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of [10 VSA Chapter 220](#).
