Application Deadline: 3:30 p.m., February 6, 2006 (firm)

**Project Completion &
Final Report Deadline:** December 15, 2006

Eligibility Requirement: Approved solid waste plan. Minimum 2 collections (Spring and Fall) or equivalent. Completion of 2005 HHW survey. Previous grantees must have met all of the past grant conditions to remain eligible for additional grant funding.

Grant distribution formula: \$523.40 for each eligible municipality, plus \$.28 per capita (2000 US Census Bureau Population, Housing Units, Area and Density). Any remaining grant money will be divided equally among grantees to increase the basic block grant.

Eligible Projects :

Funds may be used for projects that:

1. Facilitate the proper recycling or disposal of HHW and CEG wastes. Eligible costs include recycling/disposal fees, contractor services, or materials costs.
2. Support ongoing educational programs for schools and households promoting elimination or reduction of hazardous waste generation;
3. Provide educational and technical assistance to conditionally exempt small quantity generators (CEGs); or
4. Implement the public education and mercury-added product collection requirements of 10 V.S.A. §6621d(d);

Application Requirements:

A complete grant application will consist of:

1. A completed application form (attached); and
2. Application attachments (as necessary)

Grant Agreements & Payment Provisions:

Upon approval of a grant application, a grant agreement will be drafted and sent to the grantee for signature. The grantee will sign and return the original to the Agency. Disbursements for grants will be in 2 payments: 40% of the total grant upon signing of the grant award and 60% upon the State's satisfactory review of the Final Report, collection event invoices and cancelled checks (as proof of payment) and completion of the 2006 Household Hazardous Waste survey (Enclosed) before December 15, 2006. The Final Report will itemize how grant funds were spent and the extent to which local funds were used for the project. An invoice for the outstanding grant balance should be submitted with the Final Report.
